

His painful realization stemmed from flawed records and billing systems, highlighting the critical necessity and feasibility of establishing robust protocols and adopting a defensive systemic approach to record-keeping. Remember, from a legal standpoint, if it's not documented in your clinical records, it simply didn't happen. Preparation for any challenge demands meticulous attention from the entire dental team, emphasizing the need for careful, concise, complete, and diligent practices. Embracing this no-nonsense approach to record-keeping could determine the very survival of your practice in times of adversity, ensuring maximum legitimate reimbursement.

<u>Implant Overdentures: Treatment Planning</u> to Troubleshooting and Hands-on Workshop

The evolution of implants has helped us to provide a higher standard of care to patients. Patients have had the ability to choose the option of fixed restorations as well as removable prostheses. The implant over denture is an excellent restorative option for patients who have limited bone, and who may not be able or willing to have additional surgeries.

The implant overdenture must be treatment planned and managed with the same precision as fixed implant restorations. This course will review strategic planning of prosthesis, and different techniques of prosthesis fabrication. Emphasis will be placed on clinical complication issues along with strategies for avoidance and management. Clinical cases will be reviewed along with complications often encountered in practice.

Treatment Challenges & Solutions in the Anterior Maxillary Esthetic Zone

The Comprehensive pre-treatment esthetic, occlusal, and periodontal assessment is critical to select and design an optimal implant prosthetic restoration. This presentation will cover interdisciplinary considerations for restoring the natural dentition and dental implants in the anterior maxillary esthetic zone. Principles of digital smile design as it relates to facial integration of tooth proportions, gingival contours and edentulous ridge form will be discussed, along with interdisciplinary treatment strategies to manage implant site deficiencies in interdental width, bone and soft tissues.

Cases presented will highlight both Digital and Analog treatment approaches for fixed cemented and screw-retained implant restorations, pre-prosthetic site management with orthodontics, bone regeneration, soft tissue augmentation and a variety of provisional restoration options throughout each phase of treatment.

Enhancing Long Term Patient Care Through Meticulous Treatment Planning and Implementation for Implant-Supported Restorations

With extended life expectancy and evolving advanced technologies and materials, interdisciplinary treatment planning and implementation may facilitate, now more than ever, successful treatment outcomes and simplified long-term patient management with implant-supported restorations. This presentation will address restoratively driven treatment planning and implementation designed around reducing prospective complications and allowing for simple reentry to manage complications when they occur. To enhance accurate restoratively driven implant placement, the use of CBCT and intraoral scanning in presurgical treatment planning for fabricating CAD/CAM generated surgical guides will be discussed. The role of titanium and zirconia for custom implant abutments for cement- and mostly for screw-retained implant- supported restorations will be discussed as well. Highlighting the restorative perspective, this presentation will apply the philosophy of "Simple is Better" in planning and implementation for functional and esthetic successful treatment outcomes in everyday dental practice.
